Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Disposal









What is Household **Hazardous Waste and** what should you do with it?

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) is any unusable or unwanted product found in your home, garage, shed or barn that can be hazardous to plants, animals, humans or the environment if it is not disposed of correctly. HHW should never be put in the trash, poured down the drain/on the ground, or burned.

Follow these procedures to properly handle HHW:

- 1. Make sure the substance is in a leak-proof container.
- 2. Keep the original label on the container with the substance.
- 3. Bring HHW to the Recycling Center during Drive-Thru hours.

Water-Based Paint (Latex)

Donate usable water-based paint that is **in the original container** with the label, at least 1/3 full, and has never been frozen. Paint that doesn't meet these requirements should be disposed of with regular trash after it has been dried. To dry the paint quickly, use cat litter, concrete or a similar thickener.

All chemicals brought to the Recycling Center must be in 5-gallon containers or smaller. We no longer accept 55-gallon drums of any type of material. Please be prepared to leave your container for any HHW item. If you need the container back, we can take your name and phone number to call you once it is emptied.

Reuse Programs



Creation Station is a not-for-profit reuse center.

Any not-for-profit educator in Dearborn County may obtain supplies from Creation Station. This includes but is not limited to classroom teachers, 4-H leaders, Scout leaders, homeschool parents, non-traditional educators, and VBS teachers. Anyone who wants to use materials from Creation Station must provide proof of not-for-profit status and demonstrate intent. Creation Station is for adults only and is open year-round on Wednesdays from 1-6 pm.



Lending Station allows individuals to borrow items for special events, weddings, and parties at no cost. Besides the traditional glassware and party supplies, Cricut machines are also available for use. Lending Station is open to the public by appointment only.



ReProm is a formal and semi-formal dress exchange program. It is open to everyone. There are over 1000 semi-formal and formal dresses available. Open year-round on Wednesdays from 1-6 pm. Check our website for additional hours and appointment times.



Costume Swap is an annual event that offers customers the chance to share and re-wear costumes that would otherwise only be worn once. Anyone can participate by bringing a costume and selecting another. Open in October.
