General recyclables are also accepted in the Drive-Thru **FREE** of charge.



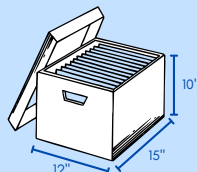

What is Household Hazardous Waste?

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) is any unusable or unwanted product found in your home, garage, shed or barn that can be hazardous to plants, animals, humans or the environment if it is not disposed of correctly. HHW should never be put in the trash, poured down the drain/on the ground, or burned.



Follow these procedures to properly handle HHW:

- Make sure the substance is in a leak-proof container.
- If possible, keep the original label on the container/with the substance.
- Bring HHW to the Recycling Center during Drive-Thru hours.

Common HHW Items

Garden and Workshop

- Fertilizers
- Pesticides
- Weed sprays
- Bug sprays
- Rodent poisons
- Oil-based paints/stains
- Thinners & strippers
- Acetone
- Epoxy/adhesives
- Water repellents
- Pool chemicals
- Propane tanks

Garage and Auto

- Brake fluid
- Transmission fluid
- Wax, polish, & cleaner
- Car paint & solvents
- Propane cylinders
- Mercury switches
- Refrigerants
- Grease & degreasers
- Grout & caulk
- Sealants
- Tar/sealers/solvents
- Gasoline & kerosene

Kitchen and Bath

- Oven cleaners
- Furniture polish
- Bleach
- Drain openers
- Tub & tile cleaners

Personal Care

- Hair dyes
- Perm chemicals
- Hair spray (aerosol)
- Nail polish
- Perfume

Pressurized Cylinders



The DCRC will only accept:

- Any size propane tank
- Fire extinguishers
- Oxygen tanks
- Freon
- Helium tanks
- Carbon dioxide (CO2)

All chemicals brought to the Recycling Center must be in 5-gallon containers or smaller. We no longer accept 55-gallon drums of any type of material. Please be prepared to leave your container for any HHW item. If you need the container back, we can take your name and phone number to call you once it is emptied.

The DCRC no longer accepts water-based paint (latex)



Latex paint can be set out with the regular trash. It must be dried and the lid left off. To dry paint quickly, use thickener, sand, dry cement, or cat litter.
